

SPACE FOR DIALOGUE




Space for dialogue on how to improve the work of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement in the field.

Participation at the Humanitarian Dialogue: A Vision Lab was limited despite its prominence on the conference agenda.



68 respondents to the paper questionnaires indicated that they would like the Humanitarian Dialogue: A Vision Lab to be repeated.
